Diabetes Research

Researchers at the University of Birmingham with the NHS are conducting screening for children, aged 3-13 years to find out their risk of getting type 1 diabetes. This is a simple finger stick blood test can be done at home or school and **we are offering the screening at our school on Thursday 6th Feb 2025.** Children identified as at high risk can then be monitored and enter research studies aiming to delay the start of type 1 diabetes.
