## First Aid

To keep you regularly informed about first-aid incidents and medication administration at school, with HSA support, we will be using Medical Tracker to email you if your child has an injury at school or receives their medication. With this system we will be able to:

- record and track first-aid incidents that involve your child
- notify you immediately after a first-aid incident by email

Please be assured that Medical Tracker is registered with the Data Protection Registrar and guarantees that all information you provide will be kept private and will not be passed on to any other organisation. Important – When we start using Medical Tracker, email messages will be sent from [donotreply@medicaltracker.co.uk](mailto:donotreply@medicaltracker.co.uk). Please add this address to your email address books (or approved sender list) to prevent messages from being blocked by your SPAM/JUNK filters.

## NHS Pharmacy First Service

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment? Accessing the service may mean that we can help children feel better and get back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

## Attendance Matters

At Hauxton Primary School, we firmly believe that all pupils benefit from regular school attendance. Full and regular attendance at school is crucial for a child's future life chances and establishes a positive work ethic early in life. It is very important for all children to attend school every day and to arrive on time before the door opens at 8.45.am and our 10 minute daily mile begins. **The school day starts at 8.45!**

Children who arrive late miss instructions and explanations and distract other pupils who have settled to work. Government research suggests that: 17 missed school days a year = 1 GCSE grade DROP.

What you can do to help

- Make sure your child arrives at school on time. This encourages habits of good timekeeping and lessens any possible classroom disruption. If your child arrives after the register has closed, this will be recorded as an 'unauthorised' absence for that session.
- If your child has to miss school it is essential that you contact school on our answer phone line before 9am.
- If you know or think that your child is having difficulties attending school please speak to the school.
- Thank you all for ensuring that your child is collected promptly at the end of each day and for contacting the school if your collection arrangements change.

## Diabetes Research

Researchers at the University of Birmingham with the NHS are conducting screening for children, aged 3-13 years to find out their risk of getting type 1 diabetes. This is a simple finger stick blood test can be done at home or school and **we are offering the screening at our school on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> Feb 2025**. Children identified as at high risk can then be monitored and enter research studies aiming to delay the start of type 1 diabetes.
