Winter School Closure

It is the time of year to test our communication methods. Do you get our email messages and read Class Dojo posts? In the event of extreme weather, whenever possible, school will remain open. When heavy falls of snow develop overnight and continue into the following day or extreme icy conditions occur, we will inform you by 7.30am if the school is to be closed.

It is our aim to open school every day but the safety of our children and our staff are our main considerations when making difficult decisions.

Diabetes Research

Researchers at the University of Birmingham with the NHS are conducting screening for children, aged 3-13 years to find out their risk of getting type 1 diabetes. This is a simple finger stick blood test can be done at home or school and **we are offering the screening at our school on Thursday 6th Feb 2025**. Children identified as at high risk can then be monitored and enter research studies aiming to delay the start of type 1 diabetes.
