'Micro:bit Coding Challenge'

Congratulations to the team of four Year 6 pupils who took part in the 'Micro:bit Coding Challenge' at The Centre For Computing History in Cambridge. The competition involved using a micro:bit (a tiny pocket-sized computer) to control a robot buggy, with two progressively difficult challenges around a racetrack final. The focus of the day was on how the participants used their problem-solving skills to complete the challenges. Many congratulations to our team above, whose buggy completed the entire course when many didn't; we are incredibly proud of your learning.

Home Learning

We are determined to keep all of our pupils on-track and to make sure no one falls behind. Speaking with our teacher hats on, we can tell you that homework is often cited in academic studies looking at academic progress for primary school-aged children as showing minimal to no impact.

So what are the benefits of homework at primary school?

In our view, it is about consolidation. So focusing on a few times tables that you find tricky or working through questions similar to what you have done in class that day or week often can be beneficial. This is the reasoning behind our homework expectations below:

Each eligible pupil will receive a £30 voucher over Easter

Families who are currently paying for school meals will save around £450 a year for each primary school child if they are <u>entitled to free school</u> meals.

- It is impossible for other pupils to know who is receiving free school meals.
- Children who are eligible for free school meals are entitled to a two-course meal worth £3.20.
- When you apply for free school meals, school will receive Pupil Premium extra money to support children
- If your child is in receipt of <u>universal infant free school meals</u> (where your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2), please apply if you think you may be eligible for free school meals.

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the ornet of the rash and until all bilsten have cruated over	
Diarrhoes and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Ru-like illness (including CDVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well anough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their scres have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scables	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking artibiotics
