Free School Meals

Government Funded school meals are available for all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This initiative from the DfE has the purpose of aiding child development, supporting academic performance and improving levels of healthy eating. **Do I need to apply for this?** You will not need to submit an application because all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will automatically be entitled to the free school meal. The meal will still need to be ordered from the school. However, **if you are on a low income, we highly recommend that you do still [make a free school meals application here](#)** as it will also allow school to unlock additional funding for your child, which will go towards supporting their development.

Breakfast Club

Thank you to those parents who expressed an interest in our new Breakfast Club provision, which is now open. We look forward to working with your children and getting to know their Breakfast likes and dislikes. 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
