Want to wait to give your child a smartphone but don't want them to be the odd one out?

You're not alone! There's a growing movement of parents across Britain who are choosing to wait to give their children smartphones, and it's simple to get involved. The Parent Pact is a way to join together with other families in your school to agree to delay getting your child a smartphone until at least 14 (when they're a bit older and more able to deal with everything the online world brings).

It's all about strength in numbers – if your child knows that other kids in their class won't be getting a smartphone for a few years either, the peer pressure dissolves. Over 100,000 families have signed already, and it's growing fast.

Learning to Swim

We are incredibly fortunate to have our own pool onsite. Our pupils benefit from dedicated weekly swimming lessons during the summer second half term, helping them to increase their confidence and skills in the water whilst creating happy memories of having fun with their friends.

Hauxton pool has taught generations of children to swim. It is our mission to ensure we can continue to fund this valuable resource. Pupils swim twice a week over 6 week - compare your donation to the cost of local swimming lessons which cost between £5 - £20 a week.

Each Year our HSA pay for:

- ✓ Commissioning
- ✓ Water testing
- ✓ Electricity for heating
- ✓ Chlorine and supplies
- ✓ Training for pool carers

Costs vary each year but can be up to £4,000

We are asking each family to contribute £25* a year to our Swimming Pool Committee help to keep our pool running *or whatever you can give
