#### **Community Swimming Pool—update**

The Pool Committee and HSA have been working hard behind the scenes to make arrangements to get processes and procedures in place to enable the Community Pool safely opened for the summer. It finally looks like they're nearly there...

Volunteers who have agreed to undertake the Small Pool Operators course will be trained in school next week. Thank you to them for giving up two days of their time—not a small ask! They will then be qualified to check that the chemical balance of the pool water is safe each day and make necessary adjustments when required,

On Tuesday 18th June, the pool will host the resuscitation training session at 6pm for families who have registered and paid to use the pool over the summer period.

## **Asthma Inhalers**

Now that the children are taking part in the Daily Mile and with hayfever season in full swing, please can I ask you all to ensure that your child has an (in date) asthma inhaler in school, if one has been prescribed by your doctor. GPs will be happy to dispense a second inhaler, on request, which can be kept in school.

At present, we have a number of children listed on our management system as asthmatic who do not have an inhaler in school. For the children's safety, it is important that our medical information is kept up-to-date and we need your help and cooperation to ensure this.

Therefore, please can I ask that you contact the Office, to update the system, if you know that your child no longer requires an inhaler or has recently been prescribed one.
