We were delighted to welcome Darren Grigas, Endurance Athlete and Adventurer, to kick off our Happy Healthy fortnight with an inspiring assembly outlining his journey from a car accident (10 years ago) which damaged his back to running the Marathon de Sables (6 marathons in 6 days across the Sahara Desert) just one year later. The children were so inspired by his story that many of them spent their breaktime jogging around the netball court on the playground.

Honor answered questions from the children in assembly and then facilitated a circuits session for each of the classes in the Hall. ### **Outdoor Learning garden clearance**

## **Road Safety around the School**

#### **Community Swimming Pool**

Over the past few weeks there have been many meetings and discussions with the Swimming Pool Committee about the pool and we have all been working hard together in an attempt to get it open. However, progress has been slowed by a leak in the pump room which blew the electrics and required an electrician to come out and undertake various repairs and upgrades. Now that the repairs have been carried out, the Pool Committee are looking for volunteers who would be willing to undertake a two-day Small Pool Operators training course and join their team of volunteers to check the chemical balance of the pool three times a day. If you have the time and would be willing to share responsibility for the daily chemical dosing of the pool, please email the Office and we will pass on your details to the Committee. Without volunteers, the pool may not be able to open.
