## School Council—KS2 Big Sleep Out—Friday 8th March

The School Council met recently to discuss issues which were of concern to them and one of the issues raised was to raise awareness of the thousands of young people sleeping rough across the UK each night.

So, we have decided to invite the children in KS2 to give up the luxury of their bed for one night and swap it for a night sleeping on the School Hall floor in a sleeping bag. Sleep Out is a national campaign, run by the Centrepoin charity, designed to support people to understand some of the realities that homeless young people face and help to end youth homelessness.

Mr Carter has (bravely!) volunteered to join me supervising the children overnight on Friday 8th March (times to be confirmed) and we will be providing the children with a basic breakfast before collection on the Saturday morning. We will be sending further details after the half term break but wanted to share the date with you, in case your child was interested in joining us. There is no charge for this experience, all we ask is for the children to bring a donation with them for the Centrepoin charity.

### Food Collection Box Harston Food Hub

We have been approached by Harston Food Hub to ask if we would be prepared to have a food donation box located in the school foyer. The food collection box will be in place after the half term break and the Food Hub would welcome donations of dried and tinned goods, should you wish to donate.

### Hauxton Primary School Book Week 18th—22nd March 2024

We are delighted to share that we will be kicking off the week with a visit from local, children's author, Pippa Goodhart. Pippa, who also writes under the pen name 'Laura Owen' has written a number of award winning books including 'You Choose' and the 'Winnie the Witch' series. Pippa will deliver an assembly and spend some time in each of the three classes delivering a workshop. To complement Pippa's visit, we are also delighted to welcome David Oates, a professional illustrator of children's books, who will join us on Wednesday 20th March to work with all classes on creating characters for their stories. The week will finish with a quiz and the children will be invited to come to school on Friday 22nd in an outfit based on an onomatopoeic word, such as 'pop', 'splash', 'buzz' or 'bang'. Onomatopoeia is when a word sounds like the noise it describes. The outfits can be as simple as wearing stripes like a bee which goes 'buzz' to using hair spray and a comb to create wild hair that has been shocked by an electrical buzz. You can be as creative as you like!
