
Dear Parents and Carers,




Diwali House Day, Monday 13th November 2023

Dog Safety Assembly & Workshop Monday 20th November 2023



The Dogs Trust visited us and delivered an assembly and class workshops across KS1 and KS2 about how to be safe around dogs (both those known to the children and ones that they may encounter when out and about). Ask your child about what to do if a dog runs at them when they're in the park. Hopefully, they'll be able to tell you that they stand still with their arms crossed upwards across their chest, with fists balled under their chin looking up and away from the dog. The children were also taught how to approach a dog that is know to them in a safe way, without crowding the dog, asking permission from the owner before letting the dog approach them.

The children were really engaged with the workshops and asked lots of thoughtful questions about the work of Dogs Trust.
