Dear Parents and Carers,

It was lovely to welcome so many of you to last week's Open Classroom and I look forward to be extending this opportunity to you again later in the year. It was also pleasing to see so many of you take the opportunity to meet virtually with your child's class teacher at this week's Parent Consultations. I appreciate that this can be challenging for those of you with work commitments or who find technology difficult. If, for whatever reason, you were unable to meet your child's teacher earlier this week, we would urge you to contact the teacher via the Office to arrange a mutually convenient time to meet either face-to-face or by telephone.

On Monday, as a school, we will be learning about the festival of Diwali which will be celebrated by Hindus, Sikhs and Jains on Sunday 12th November. The children will learn about the story of Rama and Sita, the significance of the festival and the traditions associated with it. I look forward to sharing photographs with you on the school website next week.

Next week is also Anti-Bullying Week and we will be discussing this in a special assembly next Tuesday morning. The children will also be designing a poster featuring their own anti-bullying hero, either individually or in groups of up to 5, during their PSHE lesson. We want them to think about the qualities and characteristics that a superhero would possess to put an end to bullying. Maybe their hero will have colossal feet to stomp out bullying or superhuman hearing powers to listen for unkind words. As every year, if your child would like to show their support for Anti-Bullying Week by wearing odd socks to school next week, that would be welcomed.

We round off next week by showing our support for Children in Need by inviting the children to 'wear something spotty' to school on Friday. As a school, we will also be participating in the '1000 Bearpees Challenge' with all children spending ten minutes in the Hall doing as many burpees as they can. The number of burpees completed by all children (and staff!) will be totalled with a view to the whole school completing more than 1000 'bearpees' during the day. If you would like to make a donation to Children in Need there will be the opportunity to do so next week through the ParentPay system.

In response to the recent media coverage about XL Bully Dogs and their threat, I have arranged for The Dogs Trust to come in and deliver an assembly and associated workshops for children in Years 1—6 on Monday 20th November. The purpose of their visit is to teach children how to behave safely and responsibly around both familiar and unfamiliar dogs. I am aware that some children are less comfortable around dogs than others. Please don't be concerned. The visitor will be bringing an animatronic dog to demonstrate how to approach and pet animals appropriately.

Are your children entitled to a FREE School Meal?

All children in Kingfisher class and Owl class are entitled to a universal free school meal.



However, I would like to remind you that, regardless of year group, if your household has a low income, or is in receipt of

Universal Credit, your children may qualify for a Free School Meal. Not only does this help to save you over £15 per child each week in lunch costs but it also entitles the school to £1,455 each year to help to subsidise trips, small group support, and

uniform costs. If you think your family may be eligible, please speak to Mrs Dennington in the School Office, who can quickly check eligibility. All that is required is the National Insurance number of the adults living in the household.
