## **School Council Hustings**

After the half term break we will be forming our School Council for the year. Each class will have two representatives sitting on the Council who will meet with me twice every half term to share the views of their classmates and to ensure that the pupils' voices are present in decisions that we take on their behalf. Children interested in becoming a School Council Representative for their class are invited to complete a proforma outlining why they think they would be a good person to undertake the role. The children have been invited to take home a form today (please check their bag) or, alternatively, the proforma can be downloaded from the school website under the 'Children' tab. Potential representatives will then be asked to present their argument to the class before an anonymous class vote takes place. Hustings will take place during the first week back after half term.

Teacher Tip #4

Collecting leaves and conkers at this time of year can be a fun and engaging way to help your child to practise their maths skills. You can sort them by colour, shape, or size. For older children, arrange conkers into rows of 3, 4, 5, etc. and practise counting in multiples to reinforce times tables.
