- Have the opportunity to participate in cultural and sporting workshops in school;
- Inter-school competitions (e.g. Year 5 Maths Challenge; Year 6 English Challenge; Microbits Competition; Hockey)
- Intra-school Swimming Gala

Underpinned by an ambitious and creative curriculum:

- A variety of exciting and engaging topics;
- Enrichment days;
- Experiences linked to topics;
- Educational visits to support the curriculum.

Supported by developing real-life skills:

- Speeches and voting process for School Councillors;
- Formal school council meetings;





- Voting processes and debating used to underpin the teaching of democracy.

- All year groups have access to the extensive grounds throughout the year;

- Staff specialisms (clay, singing, creativity, play-based learning, dance, French, food technology and gardening)

- In the local community – for example, St. Edmund's Church, Hauxton Centre Art Exhibition, Recreation Ground geography fieldwork);
- Intergenerational projects with Hauxton Preschool;
- Linked to topics – Science Centre, Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge Arts Theatre;
- Providing wider life skills – for example, through our residential visits in KS2;
- Enhanced PE provision through Multisports Club, Daily Mile, Hockey Club, Running Club, 5 a Day, strong on-site swimming offer and Happy, Healthy Week
- Biannual visit to Pantomime;
- Annual Nativity performance (R, Y1, Y2)
- Annual KS2 production;
- KAPLA workshop;
- King's College Primary School Carol Concert.
